

Family Business Education – A Basic Course of Family Business Study

This seven-day course of study will provide basic learning for the next generation of leaders regarding the dynamics of leading and maintaining a family business. Participants will earn a Certificate in Family Business Education from the Wisconsin Family Business Forum (WFBF).

To enhance the ability of participants to learn from each other, the course will be limited to a cohort of 15 participants, with no more than three participants from any one organization.
